### **NUS Geography Challenge 2016**

Three of our Secondary 4 students pitted against 102 teams from other schools in the NUS Geography Challenge 2016. The preliminary round of the Challenge consisted of an Individual Quiz and a series of Team Application Questions. Koh Guan Tsin from 4G achieved the Silver Award for the Preliminary Round Top Performing Individuals Category.



### All Singapore Secondary Mathematics Competition 2016

On 21 July, a total of 11 Normal Course students took part in an online Mathematics competition. This competition provided an opportunity for these students to challenge their Mathematical knowledge and skills. Ron Tan Zi Yu of class 2C came in 6th in the Lower Sec Normal Academic category.



### SYF 2016 Art Exhibition

This year's theme, Artist & Space, invited student artists to interpret the concept of space in personal and distinct ways. Two of our students, Daeng Muhammad Yasin, who graduated last year, and Andrea Low, who is in 5A this year, were selected for this event. Their works were published in the exhibition

catalogue. Yasin's submission, entitled Transformer, was an artwork he had worked on during his last year in BMSS. His work was one of the chosen pieces to be exhibited in The Arts House from 1 to 10 July. Yasin was awarded the Certificate of Recognition for his artwork.

# 48th Speech Day cum National Day Celebrations



MSS 48th Speech Day was held in conjunction with the National Day observance ceremony on 8 August 2016. At the start of the ceremonies, the Guest of Honour Mr Goh Kia Hong, Chairman of the School Advisory Committee took the salute from a combined Uniformed Group contingent in the school hall. The National Day observance was followed by the viewing of the 'Recollections' video and mass participation of the singing of National Day songs.



During the Speech and Prize Presentation portion of the day's programme, the audience were updated on the school's progress and achievements by the Principal.

One of the highlights of the day was the launch of 'The Class of 1982' awards to recognise Upper Secondary Merahans who had demonstrated qualities of resilience and/or enterprise, made contributions to the community and excelled in their respective Co-Curricular Activities. Syazwani from Secondary 5. On hand to present the inaugural awards was Mrs Mok Choon Hoe, the former Principal of BMSS (1979-1982).

After the prize presentation ceremonies, Mrs Mok was invited to plant a foxtail palm tree to mark the occasion. Our guests were also brought to the library block to witness the official opening of our performing arts studio by Guest of Honour Mr Goh Kia Hong. This facility, simply named "The Studio", costing almost \$100,000, was built from funds raised by students, staff and well-wishers.

# Hosting of Jiangnan Middle School



Six teachers and 34 students from Jiangnan Middle School (JNMS), our sister school in Wuxi, China, visited BMSS from 20 to 22 July. The visiting team was led by the school's Subject Head, Mr Yuan Xiao Ming. This year marked the 10th anniversary of the twinning programme between the two schools.



From attending English lessons to trying their hands at Floorball, the students from JNMS were thoroughly engaged and mingled comfortably with BMSS students. To allow the students to understand and appreciate our multi-ethnic heritage, the JNMS students were exposed to the Malay and Indian cultures through the playing of traditional musical instruments and dance performances, as well as local cuisines. The students also visited various places of interests, such as the Singapore Zoo, a heritage trail along Little India and the Singapore Botanic Garden, where they learnt more about Singapore and its cultural heritage.
